The burgeoning interest in Sanskrit among yoga practitioners and changes in the academic discipline indicate that a new approach is in order. Zoë Slatoff-Ponté's **Yogavataranam** integrates traditional and academic methods of learning and allows students to read texts as soon as possible. The first section of the book teaches reading and basic grammar. The second covers more extensive grammar, and by the third section the student begins to look at and understand more complex texts such as the Upanisads.
